Papers for various sessions will be selected on the basis of extended abstracts (500-1000 words). Interested authors should submit their abstracts electronically at the conference website (http://www.iatbr2009.org) by October 31, 2008. Papers on a broad range of topics including, but not limited to, freight and passenger activity-travel behavior analysis and modeling, time-space interactions, agent-based microsimulation modeling, integrated land use - travel demand - transportation supply modeling, behavioral response to policy and system interventions or scenarios, methodological developments, and survey methods and data collection are welcome. Abstracts are particularly sought from researchers in developing and emerging countries to facilitate a wide-ranging international exchange of ideas at the conference.
